#### Message from Mrs. Nellis:

It's been another excellent week in school with visits from the owner of the new local art gallery 'Come View my Art Gallery', Brian Rankin, for Year Four. The children were very lucky to not only learn about Norman Cornish, but they also received some beautiful framed pictures. We are looking forward to working again with Brian again in the future. More generally, the children have settled very well into the new term and there is a great atmosphere of learning as you walk around the school.

I would ask again that parents and carers remain courteous to staff members at all times. Glynwood staff always act with the best interests of the children and aim to maintain excellent relationships with families. We understand that there are times when parents and carers may feel upset or frustrated, but we do ask that issues are discussed as calmly as possible. I would also encourage you all to talk to staff about any concerns at the earliest possible opportunity as this is the best way to avoid issues escalating. It is best to speak to classroom staff in the first instance as they know your child best, but my door is always open and phase leaders, Mr. Otterson and Mrs. Brunskill are also always available to speak to parents too.

False nails of any kind are not allowed in school. This is for health and safety reasons and this is a policy that all schools adhere to. Please remember that earrings should not be worn. If they cannot be removed, then they must be taped up.

Scooters (both manual and electric) should not be rode on the school premises. The paths are narrow and very busy. Unfortunately a child was hit by a scooter prior to the Christmas break. We appreciate your cooperation on this matter.

The Daisy Chain project is a charity that supports autistic and neurodivergent children, young people and adults. The project are running a parent/carer workshop here in school on Thursday 8<sup>th</sup> February between 1pm and 3pm. This is around supporting children at home with meltdowns and shutdowns and developing a deeper understanding of autism and neurodiversity. Your child does not have to have a diagnosis in order for you to attend, which is why we are offering this workshop to all families who feel this may be useful.
