## Message from Mrs. Nellis:

**Festive celebrations** started with Christmas Jumper Day yesterday. The bright clothes made the school particularly colourful. Despite the play and singing practices and the special celebrations, we are trying hard to keep to the usual routines in school as much as possible.

Friday afternoon sees the beginning of the Christmas performances with Nursery's Carols around the Christmas tree and then Y1's nativity. We have given afternoon performances a later start time this year. This means that the performances should be finished close to the usual end of the school day (3.15pm).

Year Three will be leading the Year Three and Four carol service. Year Five will be leading the Year Five and Six carol service. This is because Year Six do a large-scale production in the summer and Year Four held the harvest assembly. For Key Stage Two (years 3,4,5 and 6) Church Services, children must return to school with the staff at the end of the performance. Children can then be collected from their usual classroom exits. Children cannot be collected directly from the church.

The school office is very busy and it will be very difficult for the staff to collect siblings before the end of the school day. I ask for your support and understanding with this.

For those of you who attended last year's carol services, you may remember how **cold** it was in the **church**. Unfortunately, the heating system has still not been replaced (this is due to lack of funds – there will be a donations tray at the end of the services if anyone can contribute a small amount). Please do wrap up warmly and make sure that your child is dressed warmly too (children will be able to keep their coats on at the church).

Thursday 14<sup>th</sup> December is Christmas lunch day – lunch options are restricted to Christmas dinner only i.e. turkey dinner or vegetarian Christmas dinner. If your child would like a dinner please book in on the Parentmail App.

Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> December (last day of term) - there will be <u>no</u> afterschool club available on this day.

As some of you may be aware, **Mrs. Mitchell** is commencing her maternity leave from the beginning of January. Miss Lonsdale (previously known as Mrs. Fairless) will be returning from maternity leave in January and she will be teaching Mrs. Mitchell's class. Y3 EM will become Y3 NL. Miss Lonsdale has spent this morning with the class and she will also be spending next Friday morning with the class too in order to support the transition between teachers. Mrs. Crossman will continue to work with the class.

Reminder – children should not wear **earrings** for school for health and safety reasons. If the earrings cannot be removed then they should be covered with plasters or tape so that the front and the back are covered. This is following Gateshead council policy.
