Dear Families, I hope that this newsletter finds you well and you have had a pleasant week.

Breakfast club/ After School Club please make sure that children are booked in for these clubs. We have strict staffing/ children ratios, and it is possible that you might be turned away if the club is full.

Harvest - Could any donations please be brought into school in preparation for the Year 4 Harvest Festival on Tuesday 22<sup>nd</sup> October. Tins, packet foods, cereals etc. are most welcome. Donations will be made to the local foodbank.

Key Stage one classrooms - Could parents please avoid waving into classrooms and knocking on windows to attract their children's attention at the end of the school day. It is very distracting to both staff and pupils at a very busy time of the day.

Dinner registers – Thank you to those parents who are using the dinner register system through Parentmail. For those parents not yet doing so, could you please make your child's school dinner selection online to help speed up the process and help kitchen staff prepare the right quantities of food for lunchtimes.

Reading folders – Could parents in Key Stage 1 ensure your child has their reading folder on their designated day.

Healthy snacks – Please avoid sending your child into school with sweets and sugary snacks for break times – healthy choices only please.

Robinwood Forms - Can year 6 parents please return their Robinwood medical and souvenir forms before the half term break please.

School Start time – A polite reminder that the school day starts at 8:45 am and <u>not 8:55</u> am.

Uniform - Please can you make sure your children's coats, jumpers, hoodies etc. have their name in. Staff are spending a lot of time looking for lost property each week that would be easily identifiable if names were put onto labels. A few parents have also said their child has come home with the wrongly named uniform, so could you please check your child has brought home their own clothing and not someone else's.

Earrings - A polite reminder about earrings. They should not be worn in school, but where piercings have recently been made the pupils should have them taped up on arrival at school if your child is unable to remove them.

Annual Consent Form – we are still waiting for a few parents to complete the consent form on parentmail, if you have not done this yet could you please do so as soon as possible.

Year 6 Parents/Carers – the deadline to apply for a secondary school for your child for next year is approaching (31<sup>st</sup> October 2024) – please apply on line via the Gateshead Council website.
